# Spotlight: Opportunities for Input on Housatonic Rest of River Permit Submittals

Dear Citizens Coordinating Council (CCC) members and other interested stakeholders,

In accordance with the Consent Decree and the December 2020 Rest of River Permit, **EPA has the approval authority over General Electric's (GE) Housatonic Rest of River Permit submittals for the Housatonic River cleanup work**—after reasonable opportunity for review and comment by Commonwealth of Massachusetts and Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (CT DEEP). Although there is no formal public comment period on Rest of River Permit submittals, EPA has committed to making certain GE's submittals are available to the public and other stakeholders prior to EPA formally responding to GE whenever practical.

On November 24, 2021, **GE submitted the following Rest of River document to EPA: Pre-Design Investigation Work Plan for the Upland Disposal Facility https://semspub.epa.gov/src/document/01/661267**

#### Blue Feathers

Mary Holland| Naturally Curious with Mary Holland

"The colors in the feathers of a bird are formed in two different ways, from either pigments or from light refraction caused by the structure of the feather. Red and yellow feathers get their color from actual pigments (carotenoids) that come from the bird's diet. Blue, however, is a structural color, created by the way light waves interact with the feathers and their arrangement of protein molecules, called keratin.." **Read More.** 

# Biden administration approves second major offshore wind project, to provide power to N.Y.

"The Biden administration <u>said</u> Wednesday it plans to build a wind farm off Rhode Island to supply power to New York. The approval from the Interior Department paves the way for the country's second large-scale offshore wind farm after a similar project got underway <u>in Massachusetts</u>. The administration aims to put the U.S. on a path to generate 30 gigawatts of offshore wind energy by 2030, powering about 10 million homes." **Read More.**

[...] For decades, state and local agencies have tried—halfheartedly, advocates say—to monitor and clean up the polluted air in Bayview-Hunters Point, a neighborhood in the southeastern corner of San Francisco. These ineffectual efforts have sown deep distrust among the residents for the polluters, and the government. ## How to celebrate sustainably

"...A short documentary released in 2007, *The Story of Stuff* with Annie Leonard, focused on the impact of our addiction to stuff. Leonard ask the question, 'Guess what percentage of total material flow through this system is still in product or use 6 months after their sale in North America. Fifty percent? Twenty? NO. One percent. One! In other words, 99 percent of the stuff we harvest, mine, process, transport—99 percent of the stuff we run through this system is trashed within 6 months'. Leonard says, 'All of this garbage [stuff we bought] either gets dumped in a landfill, which is just a big hole in the ground, or if you're really unlucky, first it's burned in an incinerator and then dumped in a landfill. Either way, both pollute the air, land, water and, don't forget, change the climate.'"

# Biden sets out oil, gas leasing reform, stops short of ban

"The Biden administration on Friday recommended an overhaul of the nation's oil and gas leasing program to limit areas available for energy development and raise costs for oil and gas companies to drill on public land and water. The long-awaited report by the Interior Department stops short of recommending an end to oil and gas leasing on public lands, as many environmental groups have urged. [...] The new report seeks a middle ground that would continue the multibillion-dollar leasing program while reforming it to end what many officials consider overly favorable terms for the industry. [...] The administration has proposed another round of oil and gas sales early next year in Wyoming, Colorado, Montana and other states. Interior Department officials proceeded despite concluding that burning the fuels could lead to billions of dollars in potential future climate damages. Emissions from burning and extracting fossil fuels from public lands and waters account for about a quarter of U.S. carbon dioxide emissions, according to the U.S. Geological Survey." Read More.

"...Like humans, albatrosses also have an awkward growing-up phase, trying (and sometimes failing) to figure out the best way to get into a relationship. But ultimately, when they find a good match, they normally stick together for life. Just 1% of albatrosses separate after choosing their life partner - much lower than <a href="the-human divorce rate">the-human divorce rate</a> in the UK. [...] But can climate change cause break-ups? [...] There are more bird break-ups in years with warmer water, a study of 15,500 breeding pairs has found." See Photos and Read More.

# 'Declaration of war': Pacific islands blast COP26 pledges

"The United Nations COP26 Climate Change Conference held in Glasgow this month was billed as the last chance to save the future of life on earth by ensuring global warming did not exceed 1.5 degrees Celsius (2.7 degrees Fahrenheit). [...] For many Pacific Islanders, the summit failed on the decisive action needed to guarantee the containment of global warming and denied justice to nations that are among the most vulnerable to climate-induced poverty. [...] 'To anyone in the world who is still listening to the Pacific, let me remind them that 1.5 is the last possible compromise that the Pacific can offer the world,' Satyendra Prasad [Ambassador and Permanent Representative of Fiji to the United Nations] added. 'Beyond that, you are asking their leaders to sign away the right to exist as countries on our shared planet. To lose 1.5 is a declaration of war on Pacific Governments, it is a declaration of war on our communities and on our peoples. It is that simple – period.'" See Photos and Read More.
