- 1.) July 13 <u>INTRODUCTION TO JUNIOR RANGER</u> at Pittsfield State Forest Ski Lodge. Learn about the Junior Ranger program, participating parks, and how to complete activities to qualify for your Junior Ranger patch and certificate. (*Mandatory session*)
- **2.)** July 20 <u>STORIES OF THE LAND</u> at Mount Greylock State Reservation Visitor Center. Become an expert explorer. Take a short hike and read the stories of the land through observation. Examine natural and cultural evidence of forest succession. Make a map showing your favorite place.
- **3.)** July 27 <u>LIFE IN A BEAVER POND</u> at Savoy Mountain State Forest Nature Center. Discover life in an active beaver pond, become acquainted with the diversity of plants and animals. Learn how they all live together as you explore a unique wetland. Enjoy a beaver craft or game activity!
- **4.)** August 3 <u>GO WITH THE FLOW</u> at Natural Bridge State Park Visitor Center. Become a watershed scientist! Learn about watersheds and how to protect them. Investigate the health of Hudson Brook using a watershed test kit, meet and identify the aquatic insects that live there.
- **5.)** August 10 <u>PARK PROTECTORS</u> at Clarksburg State Park Nature Center. Everything we do in the woods makes an impact on the natural world! Have fun learning about "Leave No Trace" principles and make a recycled craft.
