

WILDLIFE REHABILITATORS: BERKSHIRE COUNTY FROM PITTSFIELD TO CUMMINGTON TO ASHLEY FALLS

If you find a sick or injured wild animal or bird, immediately contact a wildlife rehabilitator from the list below. They can walk you through what to do in the animal's immediate situation.

Most wildlife rehabilitators are employed in addition to directly caring for many animals; therefore, you may not receive a call back until several hours after you have left a message. Do call other rehabilitators on the list if that's the case. Kevin Charlton (under Birds and Mammals) can act as a liaison to other rehabbers—text (413) 575-4602. Listed below in italics are three rehabbers that are generally available to direct your next step.
